MATH AND SCIENCE EXPERTS SELECTED TO BECOME TEACHERS FOR MICHIGAN'S HIGH-NEED SECONDARY SCHOOLS

*W.K. Kellogg Foundation, Woodrow Wilson Foundation Name 2013 Class of
Michigan Teaching Fellows to Undergo Innovative Preparation, Commit to Classroom Careers*

Princeton, NJ – The third class of the W.K. Kellogg Foundation's Woodrow Wilson Michigan Teaching Fellows, announced today, will bring both cutting-edge preparation and real-world expertise in math and science to Michigan's high-need urban and rural schools. *(See attached list of bios and factsheet on the 2013 class of Fellows.)*

This year's 51 WKKF-WW Michigan Teaching Fellows—among them an engineer who helped design a semi-autonomous car, an ornithologist who teaches at a local nature center, a professional pilot, a college economics instructor and more—will each receive \$30,000 to complete a specially designed, cutting-edge master's degree program based on a year-long classroom experience. In return, Fellows commit to teach for three years in Michigan's high-need urban and rural secondary schools

The 2013 class is the third group of Fellows named in Michigan for this program, launched by the Kellogg Foundation in 2009 with \$18 million in support and administered by the Woodrow Wilson National Fellowship Foundation in Princeton.

The program ultimately will provide more than 100,000 students with the level of instruction they need to contribute and thrive in Michigan's rapidly changing economy and workforce. Numerous studies have demonstrated that students in high-need schools are significantly less likely to have access to such teachers, particularly in the STEM fields (science, technology, engineering and math). "The research is clear – the most important factor affecting the quality of a student's education is the quality of the classroom teacher. Beyond that, effective educators can make a powerful and lasting impact on students in ways that can't be measured by test scores and report cards," said Sterling Speirn, president and CEO of the Kellogg Foundation.

Campuses working with the Fellows include Eastern Michigan University, Grand Valley State University, Michigan State University, the University of Michigan, Wayne State University, and Western Michigan University. These universities partner with local school districts where Fellows learn to teach in real classrooms from the beginning of their master's work, just as physicians learn in teaching hospitals. The ten partner districts for these clinical placements, up from nine last year, include Battle Creek, Benton Harbor, Comstock, Detroit, Godfrey-Lee, Grand Rapids, Kalamazoo, Muskegon, Wyoming and Ypsilanti.

“Michigan’s economic future will be driven by the STEM fields,” said Arthur Levine, president of the Woodrow Wilson National Fellowship Foundation. “Getting strong math and science teachers into Michigan’s high-need schools means both creating opportunities for the young people who most need them and building the state’s workforce. There’s no greater need in Michigan education today, and we think these Fellows will do a tremendous job in helping to meet that need. They are amazing people, and they will change tens of thousands of lives.”

About the Fellowships

- The goals of the Woodrow Wilson Teaching Fellowships are to:
 - attract the very best candidates to teaching;
 - put strong teachers into high-need schools;
 - cut teacher attrition and retain top teachers; and
 - transform university-based teacher education.
- The Fellowships recruit teachers—both recent college graduates and career changers—with strong backgrounds in the STEM fields (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics).
- Each Woodrow Wilson Teaching Fellow receives a \$30,000 Fellowship to complete a specially designed, cutting-edge master’s degree program, as preparation to teach in high-need urban or rural secondary schools.
- Fellows commit to teach in Michigan for three years, with ongoing mentoring.
- Universities agree to redesign their teacher education programs.
- Partner campuses working with Fellows are Eastern Michigan University, Grand Valley State University, Michigan State University, Wayne State University, Western Michigan University and University of Michigan.
- Michigan launched its the Woodrow Wilson Teaching Fellowships in 2010, with the first Fellows named in 2011. This year’s group is the **third class (or cohort) of Fellows in Michigan.**

About the 2013 Woodrow Wilson Michigan Teaching Fellows

- In 2013, the Foundation named 51 W.K. Kellogg Woodrow Wilson Michigan Teaching Fellows. Fellows are beginning their studies this summer.
- Of the new WKKF-WW Michigan Teaching Fellows:
 - 49% (25) majored in the sciences, 10% (5) in mathematics, and 13% (7) in engineering; sample fields include natural resources, zoology, molecular biology, aerospace engineering, and more.
 - 22% have done advanced degree work.
 - 11 Fellows have completed graduate degrees—2 Ph.D.s and 9 master’s degrees.
 - Most Fellows are Dean’s List/honors graduates, holding memberships in various academic honor societies.
 - The 2013 class has attracted a number of highly accomplished career changers and brand new grads, but an even larger group of recent grads, or “career seekers,” who have been out of college for less than five years.
 - 31% (16 Fellows) graduated from their undergraduate institution this year.
 - Another 43% (22 Fellows) have graduated within the last five years, including six who went on to master’s programs.
 - A total of 27% (14) completed the undergraduate degree more than five years ago; six have more than a decade’s experience in the workforce.
 - 43% (22) are male—noteworthy in a profession where as many as three-quarters of practitioners are female—and 25% (13) are teacher candidates of color.
 - Fellows are graduates of outstanding local, regional, and state institutions, as well as nationally known universities such as Emory, Ohio State, and Carnegie Mellon.
 - Fellows remain deeply committed to community service. Most have worked with such organizations as the Peace Corps, AmeriCorps, Big Brothers/Big Sisters, and Boys and Girls Club. Many are also very active with youth sports teams and other children’s activities.
