

# The Woodrow Wilson HistoryQuest Fellowship

## Inquiry-based learning experience for American history teachers, grades 6–12—expenses paid.

The **Woodrow Wilson HistoryQuest Fellowship**, in partnership with the Institute of Play, helps middle- and high school U.S. history teachers learn how to apply game design principles to foster inquiry-based learning. Fellows will learn to tie games to the curriculum, integrate them into the classroom, create their own games, and assess learning outcomes. While this weeklong seminar will focus on teaching one historical period, the principles and approaches are transferable and could readily be shared with colleagues teaching other historical periods, or even different disciplines.

### Summer intensive, yearlong development

All WW HistoryQuest Fellows will take part in a free weeklong intensive summer institute, to be held **July 21–26, 2019 in Princeton, New Jersey**. The program will also offer support and networking, expenses paid, throughout the year:

- mid-year workshops and virtual coaching sessions
- a ten-month membership to an online professional network moderated by Institute of Play designers
- networks with other history teachers using games and simulations in the classroom

### By invitation only

The Fellowship includes room and board (single-occupancy) for the Fellows during the summer institute and the associated workshops. There is **no registration fee** for the Fellows, school, or district. However, principals/superintendents must affirm their support for candidates' full participation, including up to two days of release time for workshops and approval for ongoing coaching time.



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
